



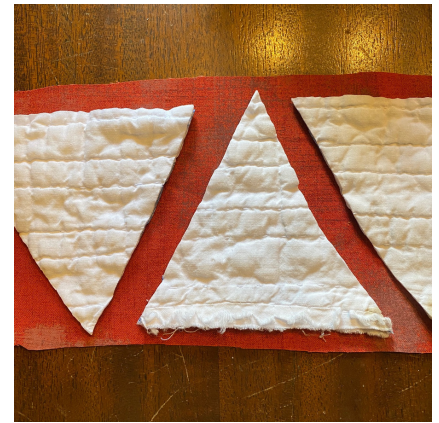
Cutter Quilt Holiday Countdown

Cutter Quilt Precious Pumpkin Swag

Start by using your cutter-quilt as fodder for as many triangles as you want to make. In my case I tea-dyed mine to fit in better with the wool pumpkins. To back the pendants I used a piece of deep orange grunge and laid each triangle face down on a length of fabric and sewed the "V" leaving the top open. *You can just do them flat but they have more weight and hang better when backed.* I then cut each one apart, turned it right-side out and pressed flat and trimmed the top. I decided on jute cord and marked out spacing for the pumpkins and between each a cutter quilt pennant. To attach them to the cord I used a wide zig-zag stitch. No pumpkins? No problem! Just use the triangles and make an adorable bunting instead! Such a quick, easy and budget friendly gift for the holidays!
